The Trustees have pleasure in presenting their report together with the financial statements and the independent examiner's report for the year ended 30 June 2020.

At an Extra-ordinary General Meeting held on 16 November 2019 the membership voted in favour of transitioning the organisation from an unincorporated registered charity to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO). All existing assets of the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK are being transferred to the new charity, The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO. The transitioning period has extended beyond 30 June 2020.

Structure Governance & Management

Constitution:

The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK, 1072573, is an unincorporated association. It is governed by its constitution which was adopted on 21 March 1998 and last amended on 02 June 2013. The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK became registered with the Charities Commission on 24 November 1998 and the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator on 01 May 2014.

Appointment of Trustees:

Trustees are elected at the Annual General Meeting to serve for terms of three years. Retiring trustees are eligible to stand for re-election.

The constitution for **The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK**, 1072573, states that there must be no less than three trustees and no more than nine trustees. Up to six trustees are elected from the membership of the charity with provision for the appointment of further trustees. At the EGM of 16 November 2019, the resolution was adopted for the legal membership of the charity to be reduced to the elected Trustees.

Management:

The Trustees are responsible for the strategic direction and governance of the charity, and for the delivery of charitable activities to meet the objectives.

On 01 April 2020, a Senior Management Team was appointed to run the day-to-day operations of the charity. The Management team comprises:

Objectives & Activities

Charitable Purposes:

The charities' objects ("the objects") are:

- 1. To preserve and protect the health and promote the relief of persons affected by Smith-Magenis Syndrome and any associated condition,
- 2. To advance the education of the medical profession and the general public on the subject of Smith-Magenis Syndrome and its implications for the family,
- 3. To advance public education by promoting research into the management of Smith-Magenis Syndrome and to publish the useful results thereof and to support organisations promoting research into Smith-Magenis Syndrome.

Achievements & Performance:

During the reporting period, the Foundation continued to deliver activities to meet the objects of the charities, and particularly:

- held member events,
- the Foundation has 534 registered supporters and has identified 302 individuals in the UK who have a diagnosis of Smith-Magenis Syndrome,
- attended the International SMS Research Symposium in Texas, USA, presenting on our research projects,
- actively raised the profile of the Foundation through fundraising and awareness campaigns,
- promoted further collaboration in research into Smith-Magenis Syndrome, particularly on the sleep safety research project,
- improved the lives of people with Smith-Magenis Syndrome through the £500 maximum individual small grants scheme,
- Completion of the initial governance review and formulation of the business development strategy for the growth of the charity over the next 1, 3, 5 and 10 years,
- Recruited the Senior Management Team to run the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO, registered charity number 1186647.

Financial Review

The Trustees continued to make extensive efforts to raise funds and support for the Foundation throughout the year. £53,034 was raised this year, £23,778 has come in the form of Trusts and Funds

Grants towards the development of our Information / Support Service and Covid-19 response initiatives, and £29,256 through charitable donations and general fundraising activities as a result of the tireless efforts of our Trustees and supporters.

Significant expenditure in 2019-20 was made to support the transition of the Foundation to a staffed Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

- £16,106 was spent on consultancy services for the governance review and production of the Business Development Strategy.
- £7,451 was spent in connection with Fundraising activities. This included the costs associated with the recruitment of the Fundraising Manager, merchandising items, and event entries.
- £4,800 of unrestricted reserves was spent on the services of a Trusts and Funds Associate.
- Salary costs of £10,983 were incurred.
- £6,741 was spent on the Safe Sleeping research project, as a second interim payment. The responsibility for the balance has been transferred to the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO.
- £2,948 was spent on the administration needs of the charity.
- £3,154 has been spent on events, including deposits towards the 2021 conference.
- Grants to improve the life of persons with Smith-Magenis syndrome totalled £1,979 and included equipment funding for a tricycle, TV protection, and wheelchairs.
- £48 was used to assist in the production of our publications.

Money assets at the year end of 30 June 2020 was £70,135.01.

Reserves Policy

The Foundation has traditionally maintained a prudent financial position of not committing to any expenditure unless the full costs could be covered from reserves. Planned expenditure would be agreed at the start of the financial year based on the value of cash assets held at the end of the previous financial year. With low yearly operating costs, and without project expenditure, the reserves were sufficient to meet the ongoing running costs of the Foundation for several years.

With the formation and registration of the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO, all assets of the existing charity will be transferred to the new charity which will assume full financial responsibilities for any residual incomes and existing commitments. These residual incomes and commitments have extended the transitioning period beyond 30 June 2020.

Plans for Future Periods

During the next financial year, the Foundation intends to continue to deliver activities to meet the objects of the charity, and the transfer of the assets to the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO to complete the transition to the Charitable Incorporated Organisation. Upon the completion of the transfer of the assets, the Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK (Charity Number 1072573 / SC044841) will be dissolved and deregistered.

Notes to the Accounts – For the Year Ended 30 June 2020

1. Basis of Accounting

These accounts have been prepared on the Receipts & Payments basis in accordance with the Charities Act 2011, Charities & Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended).

2. Nature and purpose of the funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. The trustees maintain a single unrestricted fund for the running of the charity.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes. During the year, the charity received no restricted funding.

3. Related Party Transactions

The charity's insurance policy includes Trustee Indemnity for all its trustees. No other remuneration was paid to the trustees or to any connected persons during the year.

4. Grants Received

5. Administration

All costs associated with consumed stationery, newsletter printing, correspondence, website hosting fees, virtual office fees, and insurance premiums have been combined under this heading.

For administrative purposes staff are contracted to Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO, registered charity 1186647.

6. Trustee Expenses

Trustees claimed expenses totalling £2,030.48 during the period for reimbursement of general travelling costs and subsistence relating to activities of the charity, including the strategy development weekend and attendance at the Extraordinary General Meeting.

Travel and subsistence costs related directly to other activities and services of the Foundation has been included within the costs for these items.

Reimbursement of expenditure on direct purchases on behalf of the charity is recorded under Administration.

No professional nor legal fees were incurred during 2019-20.

7. Publications

The charity has moved to electronic publishing through the website and social media removing printing of newsletters and other materials, except for a limited number of members.

Costs of £48 were incurred to support the production and distribution of the publications.

8. Fundraising

As part of the transitioning to the Charitable Incorporated Organisation, £4,800 of unrestricted reserves was spent on the services of a Trusts and Funds Associate.

Expenditure directly relating to the recruitment of the Fundraising Manager totalled £6,620.

Fundraising costs of £870 were incurred in connection with the securing of places in the London Vitality Half Marathon and the Great North Run. No charges for places were made. Participants sought individual donations and sponsorship, and these are recorded under fundraising income.

Fundraising includes all member led activities where contributions have been acquired or requested in respect to these activities.

Fundraising also includes the text to donate campaigns run by the charity.

Donations are recorded as the basis of receiving of an altruistic gift either with a general charitable purpose or for the support of a project.

The Foundation received one donation of £250 from Flynn Pharma Ltd.

The Foundation was successful in becoming a charity partner for Jeans for Genes and the Co-op Community Fund. A small amount was paid to the Foundation through online downloading of our Guide to Smith-Magenis Syndrome. These are recorded under fundraising income.

9. Events

Two events for members were organised during 2019-20:

- An event for members in Scotland took place in September 2019 at a cost of £104.
- A combined Extraordinary General Meeting and social event took place in South England in November at a cost of £355.

The biennial conference took place over the weekend of 3-6 May 2019. Residual payments of £164 were made with respect to speaker expenses.

Deposits of £2,531 have been paid with respect to the 2021 conference scheduled to take place from 30 April to 03 May 2021.

10. Grants

Grants to improve the life of persons with Smith-Magenis syndrome totalled £1,979 and included:

- £1,000 towards the cost of a specialist wheelchairs,
- £451 towards the cost of a specialist tricycle,
- £500 towards the cost of enclosing and protecting a television screen,
- £28 for flowers.

11. Research

A research project on Sleep Safety in Smith-Magenis syndrome commenced in 2018-19 with the University of Birmingham with a total project cost of £15,590. An interim payment was made this year of £5,900, leaving a balance due of £3,790.

The Foundation also covered the £563 costs for the lead researcher to attend the SMS Research Symposium held in Texas, USA to present on this project.

12. Transfers between funds

No transfers are recorded as taking place between funds during the reporting period.

As part of the transition to the Charitable Incorporated Organisation, the assets remaining will be transferred from The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK (1072573 / SC044841) to The Smith-Magenis Syndrome (SMS) Foundation UK CIO (1186647).

13. Governance Costs

The trustees commissioned Bruce Tait Associates as consultants to assist with the development and growth strategy of the charity. The total cost of the consultancy is £22,200. The balance of £13,230 was paid in 2019-20.

Costs of £846 were incurred for venue charges for the Board Development Weekend in September 2019.
